Differentiating Instruction: Guidelines for Implementation



Differentiating instruction means teaching differently to address increasingly diverse student needs. Teachers report they need training to manage whole class and small group instruction so that teaching specific to student needs can occur. This session provides evidence-based routines and procedures that increase student engagement, create opportunities for collaborative and independent practice, and provide time daily for teachers to meet with students in small groups for high quality, skills-focused instruction. This procedural model applies to any grade level or content area.
